RULES EXPLAINED – Serving

- When serving, the shuttle must be below your waist when struck.
- Server's racquet shaft must be pointing in a downward direction at the time of hitting the shuttle.
- Server's feet must be stationary, and within the lines of the serving box, NOT on the line.
- Receiver's feet must be stationary, and within the lines of the serving box, NOT on the line.
- Receiver MUST NOT move until the shuttle has been served.

RACQUET RACKET - Gosen Gungnir Beta.

This racquet is the new flagship racquet from Gosen. It comes in at the cheaper price range for the elite level racquets at \$205, \$50 cheaper than the Yonex equivalent. However, this does not reflect in any loss of quality as it is currently being used by 3 of STBA state team representatives who are all very happy with its performance.

The racquet is a medium balance stiff frame allowing for excellent control and speed without compromising power. At 86 grams it is the standard weight for any full carbon graphite racquet but has a light feel because of the even balance. This frame is the strongest from Gosen, allowing for higher string tension and lessening the likelihood of breakages during racquet clashes.

This is a great easy to use all-round racquet suitable for anyone from the regular – to elite level player.
